Background

According to the 2011 population census, about 35,784 inhabitants of the Republic of Kosovo belong to the Roma, Ashkali and Egyptians (RAE) community people. Out of them, 8,824 are Roma, 15,436 are Ashkali and 11,524 are Egyptians) reside in Kosovo. However, it is difficult to assess their actual number. On the one hand, the experience shows that many Roma, Ashkali and Egyptians do not disclose their identity in census taking; on the other hand, many have left Kosovo since 2011 through ongoing migration, which is a phenomenon that Kosovo is facing for all communities, including the majority community. The reason for the emigration lies on the high poverty level and the very high unemployment rate in Kosovo.

In the last two decades, the Kosovo Institutions together with international partners have developed a very advanced legal framework and policies based on best international standards and practices for all communities. The Constitution of Kosovo recognises Roma, Ashkalis and Egyptians as three distinct ethnic communities living in Kosovo. The Constitution guarantees the enjoyment of both individual and collective rights in line with the international and domestic standards of human and minority rights. The Law on Protection and Promotion of the Rights of Communities (Art. 9.2) in this Article specifically refers to Roma, Ashkali and Egyptians and advocates "special consideration" for Roma, Ashkali and Egyptians.

However, a good legal framework itself is not sufficient for the people welfare. Very high poverty levels are prominent, in rural areas, and minority groups face difficulties to progress in education and career. Poor labour market and social inclusion outcomes are the result of multiple, highly inter-connected factors, including labour demand patterns, skills mismatches, limited effectiveness of labour market intermediation mechanisms, poorly aligned higher education systems of subpar quality, inefficient social safety nets with built-in disincentives to work. Kosovo faces difficulties in ensuring availability of reliable data to measure and assess progress.

The Labour Force Survey (LFS) of the Agency of Statistics of Kosovo (ASK), published in April 2018 points out to a low participation on the labour market 42.8% (ASK, LFS 2017), especially among youth and females, and a high unemployment rate (30.5%). Around two thirds of the working-age active population is inactive (57.2%). Youth unemployment rate (15-24 years) is over 52.7%. The NEET rate for youth 15-24 years is around 27.4%.

On the backdrop of these challenging aspects and as a response and to meet these challenges the Kosovo Government, with the support of EU and other institutional partners, has developed and coherent, multisector policy frameworks by elaborating 2020 sectorial vision to tackle the medium and long-term challenges in employment, VET and social inclusion for all communities in Kosovo.

In what concerns the Roma and Ashkali community's education, employment, social welfare and housing, the Government of Kosovo has adapted and approved the Strategy on Inclusion of Roma and Ashkali in the Kosovar Society 2017-2021. The measures foreseen in the Strategy are being implemented by the respective ministries as the MEST, MLSW, MF, MH, MESP, MAFRD and MIA and coordinated by the Office for Good Governance within the Prime Minister Office of Kosovo.

This implies a refocus of core roles and functions towards implementing and monitoring of strategies, oversight and use of results for better policy making. The priorities that lay ahead are adequate resourcing for implementation and efficient monitoring mechanisms to ensure actual delivery.

This report provides some selected information on the implementation of the strategy on Roma Integration for the year 2018.

The Government of Kosovo (GoK) in coordination with the National Roma Contact Point (NRCP) and by involving 7 ministries, Ministry of Labour and Social Welfare (MLSW), Ministry of Education Science and Technology (MEST), Ministry of Environment and Spatial Planning (MESP), Ministry of Health (MoH), Ministry of Finance (MoF) and Ministry of Local Governance (MLG) have drafted in 2017 the Strategy on Inclusion of Roma and Ashkali Community in the Kosovar Society 2017-2021. Both the Strategy and and its Action Plan have been approved by the GoK and are in the implementation phase.

The strategy development process involved key international and local actors and stakeholders and is a continuation of the previous Strategy on Integration of RAE Community in Kosovo 2009-2015, with the exemptions that the current strategy includes only Roma and Ashkalis Community.

Therefore, this report where data was not available contains only data on Roma and Ashkali community without the Egyptian community, and for the purpose of the report format and for keeping it consistent and enable comparison with other countries, the achieved results and indicators on Roma and Ashkali are summed together. This constitutes the difference compared with previous years report.

However, detailed data for each community can be found in the attached Inventory / Dashboard of Indicators in the annex section.
